

# Homework Policy

It is the policy of the school to provide work for the children to do at home to consolidate work taught in school. We expect parents to take an interest in their children's homework and give encouragement and assistance to see it is completed.

Each week children will bring home a copy of their weekly Literacy/Numeracy/Science Targets to discuss with their parents. Homework books will be provided from Year 2 onwards, this contributes to being a record of progress and work covered.

Each year group will have the following work sent home:

## **Reception:**

- Story books to read with parents
- Appropriate games/activities relating to the Literacy/Numeracy work carried out in class
- Reading scheme books to read later in the year

## **Year 1:**

- Reading books changed weekly
- Spellings to learn
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets

## **Year 2:**

- Reading books changed weekly
- Spellings to learn
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets

## **Year 3:**

- Weekly spellings/tables to learn
- Reading books changed weekly (or as children finish their current book)
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets

## **Year 4:**

- Weekly spellings/tables to learn
- Reading books changed weekly (or as children finish their current book)
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets

**Year 5:**

- Weekly spellings/tables to learn
- Reading books changed weekly (or as children finish their current book)
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets
- Topic work as it arises

**Year 6:**

- Weekly spellings/tables to learn
- Reading books changed weekly (or as children finish their current book)
- Work related to Numeracy/Literacy targets
- Topic work as it arises
- Revision of SAT's papers as appropriate

It is anticipated that the Infant children will spend between 20-30 minutes each week day evening on their homework and the Junior children between 30-60 minutes each week day evening.

If homework is regularly completed it can make a significant difference to the progress a child makes. The Headteacher and members of staff are always happy to discuss homework with parents.
